




WAGARA KARUTA With Wagara-karuta, you can learn traditional Japanese patterns while playing cards. When not playing, you can use it as an interior decoration by displaying it in the case. Play, learn, and display Wagara-karuta!

Karuta is a kind of card game consisting of a pair of decks including torifuda (cards for taking), on which pictures or graphics are drawn, and yomifuda (cards for reading), which describe the torifuda in writing. Karuta has been traditionally enjoyed by Japanese people as recreation during New Year's holidays.

Number of players: HOW TO PLAY Three or more Reader Takers (one person) (two persons or more) 1117 MI Ш M

Spread out the *torifuda* cards on the floor so that players can see them clearly.



The reader reads out the *yomifuda* cards one at a time.
When doing this, the reader needs to be careful not to allow the players to see what is on the card.



Players listen to the reading of the yomifuda cards, and take the matching torifuda card once they find it. If you take the wrong card, known as otetsuki, you will lose your turn.

The person who has the most torifuda cards at the end of the game

is the winner.
